Aline Kamakian is the CEO and Co-Founder of FIG Holding. She founded her own brokerage firm Insurance, Investment Consultants which focuses on corporate insurance. IIC grew into one of the biggest brokerage firms in Lebanon. She is the treasurer of the Lebanese Franchise Association and active board member the Lebanese League for Women in Business.

She has also been an active member of AYA and AGBU. She was awarded "Woman entrepreneur of the year 2015" by BLC and Mayrig gained the socio-economic award in 2011. She entered the service of industry as an independent woman then ventured into several different jobs within the services sector, from airlines executive in Lebanon to hotel management in Ivory Coast. In 2014, she started a new company Crypta. She was among the team that started Aramex Lebanon, as Lebanon Country Manager then was assigned to different

executive projects in Europe and West Africa. She is the President of the Lebanese League of Women in Business and Vice Chair of Ruwwad Altanmiya in Tripoli. She is Member of the Steering Committee of United Nations Global Compact.

Through the years, she has participated in major social activities, in addition to different CSR projects and was the first woman elected for the Presidency of Lebanese Freight Forwarders Syndicate.

Dr. Carmen Geha is an Assistant Professor of Public Administration with a specialization in leadership, human resources, and organizational development at the American University of Beirut.

studying campaigns on elections and constitutional development. Her work has appeared most recently in the Journal of Refugee Studies, Social Movement Studies, Journal of North African Studies, and the British Journal of Middle Eastern Studies. Dr. Geha has a BA and MA in Public Administration. from the American University of Beirut. She has taken graduate courses in public policy at Georgetown University and has a certificate in Strategic Nonviolence from the Fletcher School at Tufts University. She holds a PhD in International Relations from the University of St. Andrews. Dr. Geha is an activist and an advocate of gender equity and refugee protection. She is a member of the Lebanon Policy Research Network on Displacement. She has published policy papers at Daily Star, and Al Havat newspaper. In addition to her academic track, Dr. Geha has several

years of practitioner experience having worked as a

consultant and adviser to international organizations, UN agencies, and government institutions in Myanmar,

Tunisia, Libva, Turkey, Saudi Arabia, Iraq, and Lebanon.

Zeina Daccache founded Catharsis-Lebanese Center for Drama Therapy in 2007, establishing Lebanon's first organization dedicated to theatre as a social and psychological therapy tool. Both her theatrical and film productions of Twelve Angry Lebanese, interpreted by male inmates residing in the Roumieh Prison, received international recognition and brought much-needed attention to the issue of penitentiary reform in Lebanon. These productions were essential to the enactment of the early release law in Lebanon, which had been published in 2002 but was finally enacted in 2009. Following Twelve Angry Lebanese, Zeina created the play Scheherazade in Baabda and the documentary Scheherazade's Diary, in which female inmates of the

Baabda prison share their personal stories in an attempt to heal their wounds and hold up a mirror to Lebanese society about the oppression of women. Her theatre productions have a dual purpose: to help participants deal with their own psychological trauma, and to give voice to marginalized and disadvantaged communities within Lebanon.

Her latest play was created with migrant domestic workers (MDWs), raising awareness about the needs and rights of MDWs. Catharsis has continued to grow since its inception, and now features a professional drama therapy training program where people learn the necessary tools and skills to become Registered Drama Therapists.
